Education

Whilst at school, I acquired work experience at *Penwood Nursery* and *Charles Flower's Wildflower Farm* (Berks) and in private gardens and arboretums in Hants and Lancs.

After A-levels in Biology, Chemistry & English Lit., I apprenticed at *Oxford University Botanic Garden*, outside in the family and geographical beds and under glass in the Conservatory; Propagation; Palm; Orchid; Fern; Cactus & Succulent and; Alpine Houses, followed by work and study at *Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew*, working in the Temperate

Nursery; Palm & Tropical Waterlily Houses, Princess of Wales Conservatory and at *Wakehurst*, in the Winter Garden and woodlands: receiving instruction and gaining experience in all aspects of horticulture.

From Kew, I went to work at *Konza Prairie*, an 8,600-acre preserve in Kansas, USA, there engaged in Bison husbandry, prescribed burning, ecological surveying and fence and road construction and maintenance.

Sole Gardener/Handyman/House & Grounds Management, nr. Cheltenham

A 3-storey Georgian villa with c. 7-acres gardens and grounds which included lawns; hedges; topiary; herbaceous borders; shrubberies; specimen trees; a newt pond garden; wooded area; meadow with springs and ridge & furrow archaeology; tennis court and; outbuildings.


Over c. 5 years, I maintained, renovated and developed the garden and grounds and maintained and worked in the house:

- Equipping the garden with tools and machinery.
- Completely renovating mossy, weedy lawns: scarifying, aerating, levelling, reseeding and irrigating.
- Renovating overgrown and neglected areas: clearing, designing plans, obtaining plants from specialist nurseries and replanting.
- Designing & implementing drainage schemes, stopping flooding of tennis court, garden and cellar.
- Establishing a proper mowing regimen for the wildflower meadow.

- Maintenance, repairs and decorating, inside and out the house and buildings.
- Overseeing and assisting with major remodelling of the Coach House.
- Arranging and overseeing tradesmen, craftsmen and contractors e.g., builders and associated trades, security technicians, tree surgeons, chimneysweep etc.
- Taking responsibility for the security of the house and grounds and the care of the cats when my employers were away.
- Care of classic car collection of British marques including *Bentley, Daimler, Aston Martin, Jensen* &c. Under the guidance of Tim Millbank of *Pride & Joy Classic Cars* of Essex.
- Driving.
- My wife, Bridget, was employed as Housekeeper, keeping the house clean and organised, sharing responsibility for security and helping in the garden.

Market Gardening

I planned, established and ran two certified organic market gardens, growing from seed a comprehensive range of vegetables, salads, herbs and cut flowers as well as soft fruit. Cropping and succession was extended with glasshouses and cloches. The first garden, c. ½-acre, worked by hand, in County Carlow, Ireland, on an 80-acre farm; the second in Wilts, of c.2-acres, largely mechanized, on a 1,200-acre mixed arable and beef farm. I also assisted on the farms with fencing, arable work, livestock husbandry and general maintenance.



I purchased a parcel of land in Mid Devon consisting of 5-acres permanent pasture; 3-acre arable field; 5acre copse of coppice with standards; small marsh and river. I undertook the following work to develop it into a smallholding:

- Design & construction of a green timber, framed barn using mortice and tenon, pegged construction to house livestock and machinery, with attached pit glasshouse for vegetable propagation. A track to the byway and a cut-and-fill site were excavated for access and a level building site.
- Resuming management of neglected hedging and overstood coppice.
- **Stabilizing the riverbank** with spilings and planting basket Willows from the government national collection.
- Growing vegetables and cut flowers for market.
- Planting an Orchard.
- **Drainage:** digging sluiced ditches to intercept and manage surface runoff and develop part of the marsh into a duck and wildlife pond.
- Drilling a borehole to supply water.

Texas Ranch Foreman & Caretaker

Private home and 765-acre wildlife ranch on the Little Blanco River in the Texas Hill Country. For c. 7 years, I undertook all aspects of maintenance and security for the absentee owner's home and contents and land restoration and game management on the ranch:

- Renovating landscaped areas around the main house: designing and implementing new landscaping to reduce water use and improve the neglected gardens.
- Maintenance and repairs of all buildings.
- Maintenance of ranch roads, buildings, fences, windmills, wells etc.
- **Upkeep of Classic** *Land Rovers*: maintenance, arranging and overseeing full off-chassis restoration.
- Operation, maintenance & minor repair of machinery and plant. Bulldozer, tractors, skid loader, backhoe, offroad recreational vehicles etc.
- **Livestock husbandry.** I introduced Charolais x Brahman cattle, Red Wattle pigs and Brown Leghorn chickens.
- **Restoring land** to savannah: brush and woodland clearing; invasive exotic removal; native grass and wildflower reseeding; prescribed burning.

- Game conservation & management: Deer, Turkey, Quail & Dove. Census-taking, harvest and recording. Halving deer herd to sustainable numbers.
- **Budget management.** Effecting a 40%+ reduction in annual non-capital budget. Securing reduced property taxes by writing wildlife management plans & reports, liaising with gov't tax and wildlife officials.
- Hiring & managing ranch hands & housekeeper.
- Researching & Planning Projects: e.g. vine cultivation; renovating staff housing, prescribed range burning; electricity generators. Engaging consultants when needed, acquiring training and Certifications (e.g. prescribed burn school).
- Executing Projects personally and managing contractors: soliciting, engaging and overseeing e.g. builders, trades, air conditioning engineers, waterwell technicians, prescribed burn boss, wood floor refinishers &c. Fulfilling role of general contractor for staff housing remodelling.
- Repairing the abandoned natural, spring-fed swimming pool: dredging, repairing the dam, restocking with native fish and managing for recreation, Otter, Beaver and Waterfowl habitat.

Landscape Design

Successfully self-employed for 7 years, providing consultation, design, implementation & maintenance for native-species landscaping in the Texas Hill Country to private and commercial clients. Knot gardens to naturalized plantings; hard landscaping such as paving, steps

& walls; small-scale erosion & drainage control and; land restoration. The TX Hill Country is an interesting region, rich in springs, fossils and Indian artefacts, with a diverse flora and fauna due to its position at the convergence of the Great Plains, Eastern Forests and Mexican Warm Deserts.

Miscellaneous

I have worked in various gardens, employed and freelance, attending to areas such as lawns; herbaceous borders; rose gardens; hedges; specimen trees; shrubberies; Winter gardens; bog & water gardens; exotic gardens; herb gardens; kitchen & cutting gardens; wall fruit; soft fruit cages; glasshouses for propagation, vegetables, fruit, flowers and houseplants; orchards; formal and informal ponds and; woodlands.

I have held positions **organizing a large private library** for Robert Jackson, M.P. (ret.), Oxon; as an **Oxford University Bodleian Library Porter** (light security); as **roustabout for Transocean Offshore Inc.**, in the Gulf of Mexico on the drillship *Deepwater Inspiration*, (crane crew duties, mixing drilling mud, assisting engineer in engine room, firefighting readiness drills.)

My wife, Bridget, has worked with special needs children and adults and as the kennels manager at a stray dog shelter. As well as lifelong interests in gardening, farming and natural history
